Preparing to Serve as a Pilot/Mechanic Family in Mozambique



We're Halfway There!

Since our last prayer letter, we finished our A1 and A2 levels of language classes (the beginner levels), and we'll be moving on to B1 this September (the intermediate level)! We have a good basic knowledge of the sentence structure and grammar, but are still working on growing our vocabulary. To help with that and to increase our ability of sharing the Gospel in Mozambique, we have begun to memorize scripture in Portuguese. The first verse we have learned is "È nele que os povos hão de pôr a sua esperança." Mateus 12,21 which has been such a good verse to remind us of the hope we have in God during this time of uncertainty in the world. Along with studying

scripture, we have found some children's shows on YouTube that have been helping us practice our listening skills. That has been the hardest skill to develop for the both of us.

Now that the lockdown has been lifted, we have had opportunities to get out and about a bit which has led to situations in which we've needed to use our language skills. It has been a blessing to be back to meeting with other believers at church (masked and socially distanced). We've realized how much our understanding of Portuguese has grown during the pandemic, and we are now able to better follow along with the sermons. My (Annabel's) doctor appointments have been another area of use for our language skills. My ultrasound doctor doesn't speak any English and the first time I saw him, the appointment was pretty stressful on both sides due to the communication barrier. Just this past month, I had another ultrasound with him, and we were able to communicate so much better! It wasn't perfect, but an improvement nonetheless.

Along with language studies, we have begun some preparations for moving to Mozambique. We're making lists of the items we need to bring with us and the documentation we need to put together beforehand as well as the vaccinations that we still need. The most helpful of all have been phone calls with one of our teammate families in Mozambique who have been chatting with us about what to expect when we arrive as well as good practices to optimize our health in an area that has more disease and poorer healthcare than we're accustomed to. Mozambique is becoming more and more real to us as we work on these preparations, and we are so excited to be going to our new home in just a few months! BUT FIRST...BABY #2 will be joining us this December while we're still in Portugal.

Over our break between courses this past June, we had an opportunity to explore parts of Portugal. We took a couple days to relax at the beach in the Algarve where we enjoyed the best Mexican food we've found in Portugal so far (aside from our kitchen). There are many castles and old churches throughout Portugal, and we've enjoyed visiting two of them so far. In most of Europe, August is a rest month. Many people go on vacations and classes are on break. We will be taking this time to explore some more of Portugal: the relaxing beaches, the centuries-old castles/churches, and historic cities!

Mozambique Ministry Highlights

As with the rest of the world, Covid-19 has been impacting Mozambique. The MAF Moz team has been able to adapt to the situation and remain operational. Although the number of flights has decreased, an impact is still being made. Recently, the team performed a medevac flight for an individual injured by a buffalo, a medevac flight for an injured miner, and a flight for a missionary who had an eye injury. The team is currently requesting permission from both Mozambique and South Africa to allow crossing of the borders in order to obtain oxygen equipment from South Africa for Grace Mission Hospital's treatment of COVID patients in Mozambique.
